Welcome to our first supporter newsletter

Two years ago Dr Noel Bayley went public about the plight of two East Timorese teenagers, Flavia Lucilda Guterres, 19, and Ursula de Carvalho Soares, 17, who faced death from heart disease because of a lack of funds to bring them to Australia for treatment.

The resulting flood of individual and corporate generosity saw the birth of East Timor Hearts Fund, a medical aid organisation established to arrange life-saving treatment in Australia for young East Timorese suffering from heart disease.

We started out with the modest aim of raising \$100,000 annually in cash and in-kind support to assist at least five patients a year. This month our eighth patient, 22 year old mother of two Imaculada da Conceicao Gusmao, had surgery in Australia. Early in the New Year we expect to bring patients nine and 10 to Australia for treatment. We are proud of what we have achieved— and hope you are as well.

This is the first of what will be a regular supporter newsletter. We hope you enjoy it and share it with friends and family.
